- 4) Swales along roadway The drainage swales running down each side of the proposed roadway from the upper detention pond towards Kearsarge Mountain Road are stone lined. Can these be paved swales or is the stone have to do with run off? Discussion?

Jon, I am the District Administrator for the Warner Village Water District. The District has the capacity to service both water and sewer for the proposed project.

All constructions cost related to sewer extension from the sewer and water mains located on Kearsarge Mountain Road up the new road into the project and to the individual lots is the responsibility of the owner of the property. The District is not responsible for the cost of the entire lines from the street mains to the property and then to the lots.
